

COGNITIVE AND EDUCATIONAL ASSESSMENTS FOR CHILDREN

WHAT IS A COGNITIVE AND EDUCATIONAL ASSESSMENT?

The cognitive assessment is a standardised test of an individual's thinking, problem solving and reasoning abilities.

The educational assessment is a standardised test of an individual's academic strengths and weaknesses.

THESE ASSESSMENTS ALSO MEASURE:

Attention and information processing
memory, planning, reasoning
reading, comprehension, writing,
mathematics, oral expression.



HOW AN ASSESSMENT CAN HELP?

To develop targeted strategies to help your child reach their full learning and academic potential.

To give parents and educators the ability to make informed decisions regarding your child's educational placement, optimal learning environment and individual learning needs.

The objective assessment can also assist in making a diagnosis of a specific learning disorder, intellectual disability or giftedness, if required.

WHAT IS INVOLVED IN THE ASSESSMENT?

A referral is not necessary unless you wish to claim Medicare rebates (e.g. 'Helping Children with Autism' initiative) and therefore a valid referral from your Paediatrician or Child Psychiatrist is required.

It usually takes 3-6 sessions to complete the assessment, which involves:

- obtaining some background information about your child
- the administration of the assessments/s
(see list below),
- liaison and communication with other professionals involved (including teachers), and
- comprehensive feedback and report with recommendations to the referring doctor (and where appropriate to the school)

WHICH ASSESSMENTS ARE USED?

- Wechsler Preschool and Primary Scale of Intelligence 4th Edition (WPPSI-IV A&NZ)
- Wechsler Intelligence Scale for Children 5th Edition (WISC-V A&NZ)
- Wechsler Individual Achievement Test 3rd Edition (WIAT-III A&NZ)
- Vineland Adaptive Behaviour Scales 2nd Edition

We will determine which of the instruments will be used for your child's assessment at the initial consultation process.

We will also consider factors such as your child's ages and the best time of day to conduct the assessment.

We will also consider whether referral onto another professional such as a clinical neuropsychologist may be warranted.

This will depend upon the outcome of the assessment and whether there are outstanding questions about your child's functioning that a specialised assessment may address.
